ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE ISSUED

An Order to Show Cause Re: Plaintiff's Request for Preliminary Injunction is issued returnable on **May 19, 2008, at 3:30 p.m. (15 mins.)**, before the Honorable Carey Snyder Hyatt, Judge of the Superior Court, East Court Building, 514 Courtroom-5th Floor, 101 West Jefferson, Courtroom 514, Phoenix, AZ 85003, **TELEPHONE: (602) 506-3566**.

No agreement by the parties to modify the pleading schedule will be honored by the court, unless the court is notified and approves of the parties' agreement. Any such agreement will not change the argument date without a court order and will, in any event, require that all motions are fully briefed and at issue not later than one full week before the argument date.

Any motion or stipulation for continuance must be filed with the court no later than four court days prior to the date set for hearing. After that date, no continuances will be granted except for extraordinary circumstances.

The proceedings will take place in the Superior court's "e-courtroom." A record of the proceedings may be made by videotape in lieu of a court reporter. Should you want an unofficial copy of the proceedings, the parties or counsel may purchase a CD for a cost of \$20.00. Should an official transcript be required, you may request that the court prepare it. The party ordering the transcript must pay for it. With this new technology, a court reporter is likely not required and the parties are encouraged to experience the court's video recording system before requesting a court reporter. **If a court reporter is required, the court must receive a written request at least 48 hours before the commencement of the proceeding. Failure to timely request a court reporter will be deemed consent to proceed without a court reporter.**
