ORDER ENTERED BY COURT and MATTER PLACED ON DISMISSAL CALENDAR

The Court has reviewed Plaintiff's (1) Verified Complaint, filed 6/17/21; (2) Request For Preliminary And Permanent Injunction, filed 6/18/21; and (3) Request For Scheduled Hearing Re: Order To Show Cause, filed 6/18/21.

IT IS ORDERED rejecting Plaintiff's Verified Complaint and denying Plaintiff's Request For Preliminary And Permanent Injunction and Plaintiff's Request For Scheduled Hearing Re: Order To Show Cause as: (1) the Complaint does not include a Verification; and (2) the Complaint does not provide any of the Exhibits "A" through "G" referenced in the Complaint and in the Request for Injunctions. In addition, Plaintiff requests an OSC hearing be set yet fails to provide a form of Order to Show Cause for the Court to sign.

This Order is without prejudice to Plaintiff filing Amended *wholly self-contained pleadings* which correct in all respects Plaintiff's inadequate filings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED placing this case on the dismissal calendar for dismissal without prejudice unless said amended filings have been filed within 15 calendar days of the date of filing on this Minute Entry.

PLEASE NOTE: This Division requires that all motions, responses, replies and other Court filings in this case must be submitted individually. Counsel shall not combine any motion with a responsive pleading. All motions are to be filed separately and designated as such. **No filing will be accepted if filed in combination with another. Additionally, all filings shall be fully self-contained and shall not “incorporate by reference” other separate filings for review and consideration as part of the pending filing.**

ALERT: Due to the spread of COVID-19, the Arizona Supreme Court Administrative Order 2020-79 requires all individuals entering a Court facility to wear a mask or face covering at **all times** while they are in the Court facility. With limited exceptions, the Court will not provide masks or face coverings. Therefore, any individual attempting to enter the Court facility must have an appropriate mask or face covering to be allowed entry to the Court facility.
