IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any non-exempt earnings withheld in excess of \$50.00 per week shall be refunded to the Judgment Debtor.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED the garnishment is a continuing lien against the non-exempt earnings of the Judgment Debtor and subject to the limitation set forth above.
